I'm Igor Dubinin, professional architect/artist and i live in Kromeriz, Czech Republic. I created this design because i wanted to draw something edgy. And crabs are edgy by definition. They also do break the "no bones" rule, although indirectly (yes, exoskeleton:), for more edginess points. The idea of this design is based on similarities between a crab's anatomy and traditional swiss knife design. It's red and it has a shell that hides retractable leg-like parts.
